<b>PROGRAM OBJECTIVE:</b>			
<p>This course is designed to prepare students with the knowledge and skills to obtain the Florida Facial Specialist license and to work as professional facial specialists. The program includes communication, leadership, human relations and employability skills; safe and efficient work practices; Florida Cosmetology Law and Rules; anatomy and physiology; art of make-up; and development of skills in performing the manipulative and electrical techniques required in the practice of the Facial Specialist occupation. In this program, the students will learn to define the composition, function, types of skin, the difference between skin disorders and skin disease, and the steps to follow during a facial treatment, including massage, makeup application and hair removal.</p>			

### **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION:**

Mid-day classes convene 1:00 pm - 5:00 pm, five days a week, Tuesday through Saturday. Theory classes are conducted every day, along with practical application each day. Classes are taught by lecture, demonstration, audio visual aids, and live "hands on" participation by all students. Some of the teaching methods used are question and answers, note taking, role playing, discussions and project assignments, and special guest presentations.

Upon successful completion of the program, a completed facial specialty registration application must be submitted to the Florida Department of Business and Professional Regulation, Division of Professions, Board of Cosmetology along with the applicable fees. Once the application has been approved, the graduates will be duly licensed to practice in the State of Florida. Students will complete this program in 13 weeks, at 19 hours weekly.
